

2016-2017 COST OF ATTENDANCE

The standard student budget is an estimate of the cost of attending NSU Shepard Broad College of Law and maintaining a modest, but adequate, standard of living. Federal legislation limits the budget to the student's own living expenses for enrollment periods only. The budget is not intended to reflect living expenses for a student's spouse or other dependents. We recommend that you calculate your personal budget in comparison with the standard student budget and make adjustments when possible or consider other resources, in addition to financial aid, that are available to you. It may be possible to increase your budget for unusual expenses related to your attendance by submitting a professional judgment request. For example, it may help you cover childcare expenses related to your attendance (day care, after-school care, etc.), if you submit documentation of these expenses to the Office of Student Financial Aid.
