Quiet Waters Park is a 431.4-acre park that is home to Harbin Butterfly & Bird Sanctuary. South Florida is host to more than 300 species of birds and more than a hundred species of butterflies, making this sanctuary, named for a former director of Broward County Parks and Recreation Division, a welcome refuge. The sanctuary is home to a variety of shrubs, trees, and other plants that play a role in the life cycles of both butterflies and birds. Interpretive signage provides information on the species and the plants they favor, as well as tips on how to grow your own butterfly garden. Volunteers are always welcome to help maintain the sanctuary's plants and birdhouses. This volunteer project will include removal of invasive plants and planting of native plants in the butterfly garden.
