






Changes in the Use of Confinement Across All JDAI Sites

N=38 grantees, comprising 112 sites




Aggregate Reductions in Juvenile Crime Indicator Type

- 33% fewer Juvenile Arrests




Percent change in juvenile confinement rate, 1997-2011
