Jamillah Williams is an Associate Professor of Law at Georgetown University Law Center. Professor Williams teaches courses in Employment Discrimination, Employment Law, and Contemporary Bias and Law. She also serves as Faculty Director of the Georgetown Workers' Rights Institute and she has an affiliate appointment in the Georgetown University Department of Sociology. Professor Williams received her Juris Doctor (J.D.) degree from Stanford Law School and her Ph.D. in Sociology from Stanford.

Prior to joining the faculty at Georgetown University Law Center, Professor Williams worked as an associate in the Employment Law practice of Paul Hastings, LLP and was a National Science Foundation Fellow and Visiting Scholar at the American Bar Foundation in Chicago, Illinois. Her research focuses on contemporary bias, the effectiveness of antidiscrimination law, and the capacity of law to promote compliance and social change. Specifically, Professor Williams uses social psychological theory and empirical analysis to examine the impact of antidiscrimination law on the individuals it was intended to protect.
