Eligible classes: Rising 2L's only (Class of 2020)

Registration period: May 21, 2018 – June 17, 2018

Fee: None for law students

The Bay Area Diversity Career Fair brings together prominent law firms and government legal departments in the San Francisco Bay Area with highly-qualified diverse second-year law students. In 2017, more than 300 law students from across the nation and 60 employers participated in the 13th Annual Bay Area Diversity Career Fair.

The primary purpose of the Heartland Diversity Legal Job Fair (HDLJF) is to increase the participation of under-represented groups in the practice of law in Kansas City. The founders and organizers of the HDLJF strongly believe that the inclusion of diversity in its many facets, including, without limitation, race, color, religion, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, national origin, disability, marital status, age and veteran status, enriches us all. Across the board, from 2009-2015, there have been gains in the number of attorneys of color, women attorneys, openly gay and lesbian attorneys, disabled attorneys, and other diverse attorneys practicing at the participating firms.

Furthermore, law students selected for interviews are invited to a networking reception the day before to meet with fellow law students of color, hiring partners, interviewing attorneys, and legal recruiting managers.

In 2017, 54 law students from around the nation participated in the IndyBar Diversity Job Fair. Twenty-nine employers conducted more than 275 interviews in one afternoon; Over 50% of interviewing students received callbacks for second interviews and as of November 28, 2017 - 19 offers of employment were made as a result of the fair.
