

**Alcoholic Beverage Law** deals with legal issues impacting the manufacture, distribution, sale, and consumption of alcoholic beverages. This includes applications for and issuance of liquor licenses, liability arising out of the sale of alcoholic beverages, and state and federal regulations governing the sale of alcoholic beverages. Laws relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages differ from state to state. State law governs the blood alcohol threshold establishing liability for driving a motor vehicle while intoxicated (DUI laws). Federal laws are implicated in other areas of alcoholic beverage law.

Alcoholic beverage law attorneys can practice for the government with a regulatory / enforcement agency, in big corporate settings, such as with an alcoholic beverage manufacturer or distributor, or in the hospitality, hotel or restaurant industry. States, counties, and cities typically require businesses to apply for and maintain liquor licenses to sell alcoholic beverages. Attorneys familiar with the licensing procedure are often instrumental in this process. Similarly, attorneys familiar with DUI laws represent clients who have been arrested for DUI offenses.
