

Legal Malpractice Law is concerned with the mishandling of either a criminal or civil case as a result of an attorney's negligence. This may involve representing clients who have lost in a civil or criminal action as a result of their attorney's negligent representation. It may also involve representing attorneys who are being sued by former clients. Legal malpractice law may involve the mishandling of a case at the local, state, federal, or international level.
