

Military Law covers the laws that govern individuals who serve in the U.S. armed forces. A military lawyer may work in a variety of legal areas, providing legal advice to service members or the arms of the military, including the Air Force, Marine Corps, Army, Navy, and Coast Guard. A military lawyer may serve as an advocate for veterans, helping to secure benefits. Military law is a distinct area of the law, which requires military lawyers to be familiar with federal and state military laws, regulations, and administrative decisions.
