**Nonprofit and Charitable Organizations Law** is an area of the law that considers the laws affecting these legal structures. Attorneys working in this area may handle matters related to the formation, organization, governance, tax exempt status, and dissolution of these entities. A nonprofit organization may retain an attorney to provide advice on daily operations and decisions concerning the organization. A nonprofit and charitable organizations law attorney can help clients navigate the laws and regulations that govern this area in order to help secure benefits and limit liabilities for the organization.
