### **WRITE-ON & GRADE-ON** **SUMMER CANDIDACY SCHEDULE**

Students who are admitted onto the ILSA Journal of International and Comparative Law through the write-on competition or by grading-on will be required to:

- I. Complete a 20–25 page double-spaced paper touching on a matter of international law.**
  - A. Summer candidates will have roughly two months to complete the summer candidacy paper.
  - B. Each summer candidate will be assigned a mentor/editor to oversee the progress of the summer candidacy paper.
  - C. The summer candidate will be given deadlines beginning in June and ending in August to submit a topic for the paper, an outline with a list of all sources, a rough draft, the final paper, and the source folders.
  - D. The final paper must be of publishable quality (meaning the paper must receive a C+ grade from a faculty member). If accepted, this paper will be used to meet NSU's writing requirement.
  
- II. Attend all MANDATORY source-pulling, blue-booking, and formatting classes.**
  
- III. Complete ALL source-pulling, blue-booking, and formatting exercises/quizzes.**
  
- IV. Attend a MANDATORY Journal orientation class (pending an invitation to join the ILSA Journal).**

## SUMMER CANDIDACY SCHEDULE

<b>First Mandatory Meeting</b> (Beginning of June)	Students will be required to attend a <b>MANDATORY</b> meeting at the Law Center, where they will be given an informational sheet outlining the requirements for the summer candidacy paper, deadlines, and will meet their respective editors. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Students will begin researching their topics for their summer candidacy papers.</li> </ul>
<b>First Deadline</b> (Early June)	Topic and list of sources due on TWEN
<b>Second Mandatory Meeting</b> (End of June)	Students will be required to attend a <b>MANDATORY</b> meeting at the Law Center. This meeting will provide students with instructions for Source-Pulling
<b>Second Deadline</b> (Late June or early July)	Detailed Outline of paper due on Twen
<b>Third Mandatory Meeting</b> (Beginning of July)	Students will be required to attend a <b>MANDATORY</b> meeting at the Law Center. This meeting will provide students with instructions for Blue-Booking.
<b>Third Deadline</b> (Early July)	Rough draft of paper due on TWEN
<b>Fourth Mandatory Meeting</b> (Mid to Late July)	Students will be required to attend a <b>MANDATORY</b> meeting at the Law Center. This meeting will provide students with instructions for Formatting their papers. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This meeting will also be used to wrap-up any loose ends and answer any questions needed before the Final Paper is due.</li> <li>- Blue-Booking Quiz</li> </ul>
<b>Fourth Deadline</b> (By midnight on first Friday in August)	Final Paper due on TWEN
<b>Fifth Deadline</b> (By noon on first Saturday in August)	Source Folders + 2 hardcopies of Final Paper due in-person at the ILSA Office
