## RECIPROCITY POLICY

The Office of Career Services and Professional Development at Nova Southeastern University Shepard Broad College of Law provides reasonable access to resources to students and alumni of other law schools on the following terms:

- 1. Reciprocity privileges will be available only to other ABA-accredited law schools, outside of South Florida, who provide reciprocity privileges to students and alumni of Nova Southeastern University Shepard Broad College of Law.
- 2. Requests for reciprocity must be emailed or mailed to Office of Career Services and Professional Development, at <a href="mailto:law-careerdevelopment@nova.edu">law-careerdevelopment@nova.edu</a> by a career development/placement official of the requesting law school. Requests must contain student's or graduate's email address. The student/graduate should wait for his/her copy of our response prior to contacting NSU Shepard Broad College of Law.
- 3. Reciprocity is not available from August 1 to December 1 during the Fall OCI period.
- 4. Reciprocity privileges include access to NSU's on-line job board and publications. Reciprocity will be granted for no less than 30 days.
- 5. Reciprocity services do not include individual counseling, resume/document review or participation in recruiting programs, or job fairs.
- 6. The Office of Career Services and Professional Development may restrict or revoke reciprocity privileges to any individual who uses the facilities or services, or to any school surpassing a reasonable number of requests within any academic year.
- 7. The Office of Career Services and Professional Development may deny all requests for reciprocity at any time NSU law students and alumni are given priority with respect to the Office of Career Services and Professional Development space and resources.
- 8. Requests for reciprocity can be made to only one of the following South Florida Consortium law schools per student or graduate per year: University of Miami School of Law, Nova Southeastern University Shepard Broad College of Law, Florida International University College of Law, and St. Thomas University College of Law.
